

While we welcome applications from families of all nationalities, our lengthy waiting lists mean that realistically there is very little chance of applicants from Admissions Categories 6 and 7 being accepted into AAS.

Our Board policy limits us to admitting no more than 15% of students holding any citizenship other than the United States, the United Kingdom and Canada. This 15% limit has been reached at virtually all grade levels for our Russian citizens and we will therefore not be able to admit any additional local students until some of our current Russian families decide to leave AAS.

If your child holds a Russian passport, then that passport takes precedence on the territory of the Russian Federation – even if your child also has full citizenship rights in another country. (For further clarification, please refer to Federal Law “On Citizenship of the Russian Federation” of 31st May, 2002, Article 6: “A citizen of the Russian Federation, who also holds the citizenship of another country, shall be considered by the Russian Federation as being a citizen of only the Russian Federation.”)

So as to avoid raising unwarranted hopes and creating a sense of frustration for families who may spend many years anticipating a place in our school, we would encourage you to contact us prior to submitting an application, so that we can give you an accurate assessment of your chances of being admitted.
